Contextual Overview

- South Africa is experiencing the highest burden of HIV in the world with 5.
 7 million people living with HIV.
- AIDS related deaths resulted in surge of orphaned children reported at approximately 3.7 million in the country and this includes children without a living biological mother, father or both parents, and is equivalent to 21% of all children in South Africa.
- According to the Department of Social Development Surveillance System of maternal orphans there is a total of 1,346,300 maternal orphans in the country.
- The protection of children in South Africa is informed by international and national instruments to mention the few, the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, the African Charter on the Welfare and Rights of the Child, the Millennium Goals, and the UN declaration on HIV and AIDS and the South African Constitution of 1996
